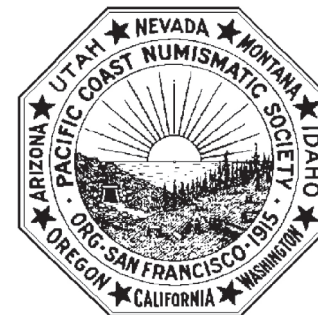


PCNS 100th Anniversary Medal Designs Sought

Dan Hipple presented his talk, **Toivo Johnson's Bad Idea.**

Toivo Johnson was a Maine coin dealer specializing in U.S. commemorative coins. He was a 30 year member of the ANA. He issued a set of medals honoring coin designers in 1962 and 1963. Dan found the series particularly difficult to research and the information that is available generally cites on or two sources.

Toivo approached Medallic Art with his idea for the series, but the company declined participation unless he modified some of his plans for the medal designs. Metal Arts Company in Rochester, New York had no problems with his idea and agreed to make the medal series. Six different medals were struck, but did not sell well.

Wanting to learn more about the series, Dan learned that Toivo had two other large medals designed and struck in addition to a smaller sized series issued for the centennial of Maine's statehood. After acquiring a store card issued by another Johnson in Maine, Dan decided to call the phone number on the 30+ year old token and found Toivo's son on the other end. We will be hearing more about his research in the future.

Exhibits included:
