



1681 Silver French Jeton

Issued to honor the new Dauphine, Anna Marie Christine de Bavière. The celestial crown commemorates NOVVM DECVS ADDITA COELO (A new glory added in the sky).

1656 Silver French Jeton

Issued by the Army Accountants, Ordinaire des Guerres. Jetons passed as currency, but they avoid the distasteful practice of the monarchy actually paying money to those who served. The legend, OPPORTVNVS ADEST, (Opportune appearance) refers to the appearance of a celestial shield during the Trojan War. Many call this a UFO jeton.
