Lloyd Chan presented his talk, **Collecting a Year: 1909**.

Collecting a year is like collecting a slice of history. Lloyd's father's marriage was arranged in 1909, but he could not travel to China to meet and retrieve his bride until 1912 because of the Chinese War of 1910. Lloyd's collection consists of the coins struck in the U.S. and Canada in that year. He compared what constitutes a complete set of minor coins, silver, and gold as well as type sets. He also compared prices in various grades. The U.S. set contains many more coins because four mints were in operation and therefore costs more in most grades. The Canadian set, however, is more expensive in MS-64 because of two rarities.

Member Exhibits:

Scott displayed a 1917 10 centimes coin in NGC MS-64, very rare in mint state. He also displayed a Peruvian 1873 20 Centavos Aguas Del Rimac Cantina token in a NGC MS 63BN holder.

Dan exhibited several 1909 Hudson-Fulton medals made for the American Numismatic Society in various sizes in aluminum, bronze, and silver. He also displayed a 1909 Lincoln medal by Bella Lloyd Pratt.

Jerry displayed a set of brothel tokens from the 1907-1912 time period and one from the Rose that dates to about 1939.

Stephen brought a 2009 CSNA medal commemorating the 100th anniversary of the Santa Monica Pier with a design from a 1933 So-Called Dollar, listed in Hibler & Kappen.

Michael brought a first edition of Pradeau's book on Mexican Numismatics, Ozzie Stout's personal copy along with original correspondence with the author.

Bill displayed a selection of shell cards from the 1800s, the topic of a new catalog by Q. David Bower's to be published by the Token and Medal Society.

Herb shared some Chinese tokens, one of which proved to be Japanese from Hawaii.
