

## PCNS BOOK SALE

**NEXT MONTH: WEDNESDAY NOVEMBER 29, 2017**

Our November meeting will feature a Numismatic Book Sale of titles from the reference library of PCNS member and retired coin dealer Stephen Huston. This sale will be held as a benefit for PCNS. All collectors and dealers are invited to attend.

The sale will include most of Huston's books on US, World, tokens, early modern coinage, with selected titles on Ancients and Medieval. This will feature individual numismatic titles — most in hardback and out-of-print.

### OCTOBER PROGRAM TOPIC

President Bill Hyder will give a presentation on *Collecting Illustrious Images*, focusing on coin illustrations as they were before modern photographic techniques. Bring older numismatic books or plates, or — when all else fails — your new acquisitions or just stuff you think might interest us.

### SEPTEMBER PROGRAM REPORT

David W. Lange gave an informative presentation on three recent rarities in early US silver coinage which had passed

through his hands at NGC in recent years, including one completely new die-pair variety.

The new variety had been reported by the its most recent purchaser, who, though a relatively new collector, suspected it was not previously documented. It was an 1822 Quarter with a known 1822 obverse paired with with a reverse die previously known only with 1823 and later years. This discovery coin is now B-3 for the date and series.

### SEPTEMBER MEMBER EXHIBITS

- Mark brought a new book on Mexico Mint Pillar Coinage from 1732 to 1771, noting its instant popularity in Mexico.
- Ed had 2 early large cents, 1800 and 1802, noting that the 1800 appears to have the 80 of the date over 79, indicating a recut or repunched die originally made for an earlier year. Also some recent souvenir tokens from S. Dakota and Wyoming.
- Herb brought an 1841-O dime, but noted that he had not been able to determine whether it is the small-, med-, or lg-O var.
- David brought a new book, “Forgotten Colorado Silver — Joseph Leshner’s Defiant Coins.”
- Michael brought in a group of US coins from 1830s–50s: a Bust half, Seated dollar, a Gold dollar, and 1853-C Half Eagle.
- Jerry brought in two SF tokens engraved on 19th Century US silver coins described in one of his 2013 papers.
- Bill had sheep shearing tokens from Santa Cruz Island, and a Rancho Jolama token often misattributed as a brothel token.
- Dan had a large bronze medal of Louis XIV (The Sun King) from the Paris Mint.

### SEPTEMBER DRAWING

5 prizes: Ed got a coin paperweight, a British “To Hanover” jetton, and a 1oz Copper round. Bill got a silver advertising piece from the Hoffman & Hoffman Mint (then in Carmel), and Jason received a British Conder token of the Picard Lead Works in Hull.
