ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

PACIFIC COAST NUMISMATIC SOCIETY, INC.  
A Non-Profit Corporation

The name of this corporation is PACIFIC COAST  
NUMISMATIC SOCIETY, INC.

TWO: The purposes for which this corporation is formed are:

(a) The specific, initial and primary purpose for which  
this corporation is formed is to promote, develop, foster,  
numismatics, or coin collecting, in all of its branches along  
educational, historical, and scientific lines, and to provide  
opportunities for collectors to share in an organization of mutual  
interest and good fellowship, as well as to promote coin collecting  
among the general public by way of general education.

(b) In furtherance of the primary and initial purpose of  
this corporation, it may lease, sell, manage, exchange, refit,  
remodel, and improve any building or buildings already constructed,  
take in exchange, purchase, or otherwise acquire equipment and  
furnishings necessary and convenient for the use and occupation  
thereof; own, hold, maintain, sell, exchange, lease, convey,  
transfer, pledge, hypothecate, and encumber by mortgage or deed  
of trust, or otherwise dispose of any property so acquired;  
receive donations and accumulate funds for the accomplishment of  
any of the aforesaid purposes; invest funds in any and all forms  
of property, including savings banks, savings and loan associations,  
government bonds, common or preferred stocks whether listed upon  
a recognized stock exchange or not, and to do all things and to  
have all the powers granted or allowed to a non-profit corporation  
formed under the laws of the State of California as they are now  
constituted and as they may be, from time to time, amended; to  
do every act and thing necessary and convenient to carry out and  
obtain the above specified purposes to the same extent as natural  
persons may.

1 (c) This corporation may engage in any lawful activity,  
2 except that of a bank, public utility, or credit union, which  
3 conforms to the primary purpose for which it is formed; it may  
4 engage in legal and business matters as will enable the corporation  
5 to effectuate its primary purpose, but it may not engage in business  
6 for the profit of any individual, partnership or corporation.

7 THREE: (a) This corporation is organized pursuant to Part 1,  
8 of Division 2 of Title 1 of the Corporations Code of the State of  
9 California, the General Non profit Corporation Law.

10 (b) No part of the net earnings of this corporation shall  
11 inure to the benefit of any individual member or other individual,  
12 and this corporation shall not engage in any activities designed  
13 to influence legislation, or that of lobbying or legislative  
14 advocate.

15 (c) No real property owned by this corporation shall be  
16 operated for the benefit of any individual, and all property  
17 owned by this corporation shall be operated for the benefit of  
18 this corporation alone; further, in the event of liquidation,  
19 dissolution or other termination of the existence of this  
20 corporation, no property of the corporation, real or personal,  
21 shall inure to the benefit of any individual or profit corporation,  
22 but shall be distributed only to other non profit corporations or  
23 unincorporated associations organized and operated for charitable  
24 or educational purposes only.

25 (d) The principal office for the transaction of the  
26 business of this corporation is located in the City and County of  
27 San Francisco, State of California.

28 FOUR: (a) The number of directors of said corporation may be  
29 fixed by the by-laws or any amendments thereto.

30 (b) The persons appointed to act as the first

 17 provided in Title 1, Division 1, part 8, of Chapter 1, of the  
 18 Corporations Code of the State of California.

 20 tion, under the laws of the State of California, the undersigned,  
 21 constituting the incorporators of this corporation, and including  
 22 the persons named hereinabove as the first directors of this  
 23 corporation, have executed these Articles of Incorporation this
